Dear Parishioners:

Today is the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Easter. John the Evangelist starts his story this way: "on the evening of the first day of the week..." John is operating in a new time zone. According to the Jewish reckoning, a day began with sunset, a concept that goes back to Genesis 1, which counted the days saying, "Evening came and morning followed, the first day..." When John calls the evening of the day of Christ's resurrection the first day, he is speaking about the first day of the new creation, a symbolic day that will never end.

The news of the resurrection spread among the disciples. Jesus made himself present amid the disciples who were hiding in the upper room. Now, on this first day of the new creation, just as the Creator had blown the breath of life into Adam, Jesus breathed his own Spirit over them and asked them to receive it. Those who received Jesus' Spirit and peace received the power to carry on his mission of forgiveness. Forgiveness brings people into union with God and one another. This is the reason why St. Pope John Paul II designated this Sunday as *Divine Mercy Sunday*.

John could have ended his Gospel with this appearance of Jesus. But that could have made it appear that the Gospel closed with the women and men who were present in that room. John was writing for all Christians and wanted to include us in the story. Thus, he introduced us to Thomas, the twin brother of everyone who was absent on the first night. For those of us who do not believe because they have not seen and touched the risen Jesus, these words of Jesus are for us: *"Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."*

# Excerpt from the Catholic Register, April 26, 2020

Pope Francis said forced isolation caused by COVID-19 posed the danger of people living the faith only for themselves and becoming detached from spiritual Community, the sacraments, and the Church.

Online Masses and spiritual communion do not represent the Church, he said. This is the Church in a difficult situation that the Lord is allowing, but the ideal of the Church is always with the people and with the sacraments – always, Pope Francis said.

Masses, prayers and faith-based initiatives have been offered online, and the faithful have been encouraged to make an act of spiritual communion given their lack of access to holy Communion, but this is not the Church, the Pope said.

One's relationship with Jesus is intimate, it is personal, but it is in a community, and this closeness to Christ without community, without the Eucharist, without the people of God assembled together, and without sacraments is dangerous, he said.

The Pope said the bishop wrote to him before Easter when it was announced Mass would be celebrated in an empty St. Peter's Basilica. He said the bishop questioned the decision and asked, *When St. Peter's is so big, why not put 30 people at least (in the basilica) so people can be seen.* THE CHURCH, THE SACRAMENTS AND THE PEOPLE OF GOD ARE CONCRETE, the Pope said.



Let us all join, as a community, in prayer for vocations to the priesthood, religious or consecrated life. We also ask that you pray for our six soon-to-be priests, along with all who are discerning and who are currently in formation at St Augustine's Seminary. Thank you for your continued support as we work and pray together to the Lord of the Harvest to send labourers into His vineyard.

**PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS:** O God, who wills not the death of a sinner but rather that he be converted and live, grant we beseech you, through the intercession of the Blessed Mary ever Virgin, St Joseph, her spouse, St Junipero Serra, and all the saints, an increase of labourers for your Church, fellow labourers with Christ to spend and consume themselves for souls through the same Jesus Christ, Your Son, Who lives and reigns with You, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God forever and ever. Amen.

There is nothing more secure, nothing more lasting. Come and share the thrill of proclaiming this truth through your life as a priest, religious or deacon.
