Dear Parishioners of St John Fisher Church: Greetings of Peace!

How are you doing? I hope that you are all safe and well. Let us pray the rosary together every day as Pope Francis encourages us to do, to ask the intercession of our Mother Mary to eradicate this pandemic.

Here is a story you may have heard before: Jesus checks in with St Peter as he was tending the pearly gates. Peter looked a little bummed, so Jesus asked, "*What is wrong*." Peter said, "I TRY TO DO MY JOB. IF PEOPLE SHOW UP AND WANT IN BUT DON'T LOOK READY, I TELL THEM TO GET A LITTLE MORE PURIFIED, THEN COME BACK. I CLOSE THE GATE BEHIND THEM." Jesus asked, "So what's the problem?" Peter responded, "I HATE TO TELL YOU THIS, BUT SOME OF THEM SNEAK AROUND TO THE BACK DOOR AND YOUR MOTHER LETS THEM IN."

This story conveys a truth: Mary is eager to do everything she can to help us alleviate our suffering on earth and thereby help us to enter heaven.

Today we celebrate the *Ascension of the Lord*. Upon Jesus' arrival in heaven, a vast host of angels greeted him. After the formalities, they asked him who he had left behind on earth to finish the work he had begun. Jesus replied, "*Just a small group of men and women who love me.*" "THAT'S ALL?" asked the angels, astonished. "WHAT IF THIS TINY GROUP SHOULD FAIL? DO YOU HAVE PLAN B?" Jesus replied, "*I have no other plans.*" (Story Telling the Word, p.228)

Dear people of God, hear the voice of the angels: *Why do you just sit there looking up at the skies? Roll up your sleeves and go! Now, by the power of the Holy Spirit we are commissioned to go and be his witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.* We are given the opportunity, as we are locked down in our own houses, to teach our children and members of the family the Christian way and tradition. Gather your family in the evening to pray the rosary. Have your meal together without gadgets and share stories with each other. Start to pray before and after meals. For kids: try to help around the house; try to be kind to the elderly in your home. Teach ourselves and the children to do something for the poor and the needy. Our task is to observe his commandment of love and service.

Finally, we all miss the community celebration of the Eucharist. Let us pray to God to eliminate the pandemic in our midst to begin living once again our normal way of life. Our relationship with Jesus *is intimate and personal, but it is in a community*. And this closeness to Christ without community, without Eucharist, without the people of God assembled together and *"without the sacraments is dangerous"*, Pope Francis said.
