FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners: Greetings of Peace!

I am glad to announce to you that our public celebration of the Mass is now open to at least 15% of our church capacity. Thanks be to God! It is much like the seed in Jesus' parable that starts small and later grows to its full potential.

The seed that was planted by the farmer is primarily under the watchful care of God. The kingdom will grow and develop *"without our knowing how it happens"* and regardless of all obstacles. The reign of God will flourish and grow because God is a faithful and fastidious caretaker.

Jesus' parable of the seed is comparing natural growth to the growth of the church. It all started from a small beginning: from a son of a carpenter and a handful of humble fishermen; it has started to grow gradually and tremendously by the thousands, by the millions and by the hundred million by the end of our present century. And it will continue to grow. Like a big mustard tree, it will be a haven, a shelter for all kinds of people.

Jesus' parable of the seed is comparing natural growth to the growth of our St John Fisher Parish. The seed has been planted through the faith we received in baptism. The seed of the word of God is there. The seed grows of itself. The nourishment is always available through the sacraments and most especially the Eucharist. Unfortunately, most of us are being discouraged and impatiently looking for immediate result and waiting for success.

What is the matter with St John Fisher Parish? Nothing. I can see our parish growing through our generous people. We are starting to see the real meaning of the liturgy in what we are doing. We begin to realize that we have to reach out to people, especially the needy, for our Eucharist to have value and meaning. Of course, it is not the way we like it nor in the period in which we planned for it to materialize. Precisely! The meaning of this parable is that growth will happen naturally, in God's own time, without us knowing how or when. Growth is a slow process. Let us be patient and allow God's action to take its course. We are not expected to see results and harvest success, we are only expected to sow the seed. Our role is to continuously sow the seeds of Jesus' love, care, and support with one another. If we do this, growth is surely forthcoming. The results may not be in my lifetime, and I don't care. There will be results.

Jesus' parable of the seed is comparing natural growth to the growth of faith that parents sow in their own family. We often hear complaints from parents on how to pass on their faith and Christian values to their children. Most of them were frustrated and say: "I don't know how this happened? We did all we could. We brought our children to regular Sunday Mass, and that was fine when they were young. Now that they are older, they have completely stopped coming to church with us." A mother complained that she used to talk to her children about Christian and family values and now that they are adults, they are doing the opposite of what she had wanted them to be.

Dear Parents, the good deeds that you have done are like seeds. You hardly know they are there. They are tiny, but they are there and will grow, nevertheless. That seed is the kindness we do, the worship we share with them, the good conversation around the dinner table, the soup to the sick neighbour, the decisions to put the family first. The seed is making your children bring back the little things they may have stolen and apologize for it. The seed is having them catch you at prayer.

Father Chuck Gallagher says in his inspiring book, Parents are Lovers, "The greatest legacy that we can ever leave our children is memories of us." Joyful, faith-filled, and loving memories of us. Parents are sowers. We should believe that every good seed that we sow contains, within itself, enough germinal force to mature and produce fruit.

Under the watchful care of God, the seed that we sow in the parish, at home, in our workplace, and in the streets, will grow and develop *without our knowing how it happens* and regardless of all obstacles. With our cooperation, our faith, the faith of our parish community and the faith of our children, will flourish and grow in God's phase and time, because God is a faithful and fastidious caretaker.
