

#### Dear People of God:

The Gospel for this *Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time* speaks directly to us through the firsthand experience of the disciples themselves. They were in the boat with Jesus. As they cross over the sea, a violent storm blows up. The boat takes on water and is in danger of sinking. The disciples were terrified. Jesus sleeps through the storm on a cushion in the stern of the boat.

It must have been an unusual storm for the disciples to be terrified. Many were fishermen by trade and had lived their lives on this same sea. They had endured its storms and squalls a hundred times before. In the midst of this terrible event, they shout at Jesus: *"Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?"* 

We are navigating across this vast ocean of our life. We have many fears about the "out there" of life, and we have many anxieties about the "in life" of life. We are in one of the most frightening moments of our century - the pandemic. We find ourselves helpless. We have done almost everything humanly possible. Yet it stays. Now the moment of desperation has arrived in each one of us. Like the disciples we cry out: "Help me, O God, for my boat is so small and your sea is so great."

The Lord awakens and says to the sea, "Quiet! Be still!" A disciple is a learner. Our panic in the storm and our lack of trust in the Lord tells us that we are still only beginners in the business of Christian discipleship. The lesson is that the Lord does not abandon us when we have confident faith in Him. Jesus remains present with us all through life: He is with us in life's stormy passages and in moments of calm.

What shall we say of ourselves? Have we progressed beyond the disciples in today's Gospel incident? It is time to remember our troubled past, and the difficult times of our lives. What happened? The Lord never fails the disciple who has confidence in Him. Let us listen once more in the silence of our hearts:

"QUIET! BE STILL!"

**WHO WAS ST JOHN FISHER?** St John Fisher was an English Catholic bishop, cardinal, and theologian. He was also an academic and eventually served as Chancellor of the University of Cambridge.

Fisher was executed by order of Henry VIII during the English Reformation for refusing to accept the King as Supreme Head of the Church of England and for upholding the Catholic Church's doctrine of papal supremacy. He was named a cardinal shortly before his death. He is honoured as a martyr and saint by the Catholic Church.

After King Henry VIII divorced Catherine of Aragon to marry Anne Boleyn in 1533 without an annulment from the Pope, Fisher preached against divorce from the pulpit. Eventually, the king severed his ties with the Catholic Church and established the Church of England. King Henry VIII demanded England's bishops sign a document acknowledging him as head of the Church. Only one - Bishop John Fisher, did not. Because of that, John Fisher was beheaded, and his head was displayed on London Bridge and then thrown into the river.

He shares his feast day with St Thomas More. Both saints are known for their faithfulness and deep love for the Church; they were faithful servants to the king but put God's kingdom first.

John Fisher died in June 1535. His body was buried first at All Hallows, Barking (an ancient Anglican Church), and then moved to St Peter's Ad Vincula in the Tower (Parish church of the Tower of London), where it lies beside that of Sir Thomas More.
