Dear People of God:

The First Reading from the Book of Wisdom is set as an introduction: God did not make death, and he does not delight in the death of the living... For God created man for incorruption, and made him in the image of his own eternity...

God made all so that all might be alive. Yet, for many people death is the end of everything. Is there life after death?

Now we find the answer of life after death from Jesus himself. Today he gives us the story of Jairus' daughter who had a serious sickness and died afterwards. When Jesus came into the room, he said to the people present: "Why do you make a commotion and weep? The child is not dead but sleeping." For Jesus death is temporary, a matter of sleeping. When we close our eyes, we just fall asleep for a while - we do not die forever.

A physician who enjoyed a good reputation for the wonderful cure he had made, but who did not believe in God, went to see Saint John Bosco one day. When he arrived at his residence, he asked the saint to cure him since, as a doctor, he had cured many. The saint asked him to kneel and pray but the physician refused because he did not believe in God or miracles. He claimed he was a man of science and was not wont to believe in those things.

The doctor was suffering from epilepsy and the saint would not touch him unless he knelt and prayed. Left with no choice, the man complied; he knelt down and made the sign of the cross. While praying, the saint laid his hands on him, and a miracle took place. He was cured, went to confession, and received communion from the saint himself. Don Bosco later told everyone about the miracle: "One can believe and be cured only by kneeling down and praying."

So let us turn to Jesus. Let us put our whole trust in him. He will see you through the rough times and the dark passages and the days of great loss.
