In this *15th Sunday in Ordinary Time* Jesus continues his lesson about being a prophet. A prophet is simply one who speaks for God, who proclaims that truth, especially when that truth is being ignored or violated in society.

Brother Juniper once asked St Francis, "Teach me to preach as eloquently as you. I am not good with words." "I WILL TEACH YOU TO PREACH MORE ELOQUENTLY THAN I," said Francis. "MEET ME TOMORROW, AND I SHALL TEACH YOU TO PREACH."

Brother Juniper dutifully met Francis early the next morning. To Juniper's surprise, they began walking. They walked through the marketplaces, smiling at the laborers, the merchants, the children. They helped an old woman carry her wash up a set of stairs. They walked. Finally, an exasperated Brother Juniper asked: "Francis, when shall you teach me to preach?" The saint replied, "WE ARE PREACHING."

Jesus called the twelve and sent them out two by two. You were called and sent as married couples. Some were called and sent as single individuals. Some were called and sent as professionals and businessmen and women. We are the twelve sent to the world to spread the good news of Jesus.

Training is not the problem. None of the disciples were professionals. The twelve went out with nothing more than a companion, the clothes on their backs and the fire in their hearts.



CONFIRMATION UPDATE

We are pleased to be able to offer the Sacrament of Confirmation for candidates who were in Grade 7 in 2019/2020.

MANDATORY CONFESSION: Saturday, July 24th @ 11 a.m. ▶ Effective June 30th, capacity has increased to 25% and therefore, parents may accompany their children into the church. Candidates are asked to wait patiently for their turn for Confession.

CONFIRMATION DATES:

Tuesday, July 27th & Wednesday, July 28th @ 7 p.m. ▶ Effective June 30th, capacity has increased to 25% and therefore on the evenings of the Confirmation Celebrations, each Candidate may be accompanied by their Sponsor and 2 guests (presumably their parents).

- ▶ Photographs are not allowed during the Confirmation mass. Immediately following the Mass, Father Imperial will be available for pictures with families and the Confirmandi in front of the altar. Families will approach the altar in a single file line.
- ▶ Please note: No robes will be provided this year.
