FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

On behalf of St John Fisher Church, I would like to wish all the teachers and students of our Catholic Schools a safe and healthy school year. I will be praying for you all. May God be your strength.

Today we celebrate the *Twenty Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time*. Today's Gospel relates to us the story on how Jesus would like to know if his message is being understood by people and especially his disciples. He asked: *"Who do people say that I am?"* The survey says that people have known him in so many ways. They are not clear in their answers. But for Jesus the most important survey is among his own disciples: *"But who do you say that I am?"* Peter got it right. Like Peter, all Christians today proclaim that Jesus is the Christ, the anointed one. Does faith alone save or does faith combined with corporal and spiritual works save us?

In the Gospel, Jesus makes it clear that professing faith in him must be lived out and will lead to suffering for his followers as it will for him.

Let us hear the answer of a young American girl who was asked about Jesus in the Gospel: "Jesus is not a big deal, and although an important person, he is not very strong, not very challenging, and certainly not demanding." Professor Kenda Dean, Associate Professor of Youth at Princeton Theological Seminary, reports that in her classes she hears young people casually say, "Well, it doesn't really matter. Everyone goes to heaven when they die. Jesus forgives everything we do in the end."

Isn't that comforting? What an easy Jesus! And when asked to describe this gentle Jesus, students, just like their parents, would write words like, LOVING, FORGIVING, KIND, FRIENDLY, MERCIFUL, GENEROUS. Bottom line? You couldn't ask for a nicer guy. You wonder: Just who is this Jesus, this sweetheart of a man, as the youth describe, that we embrace? He is nothing like the gospel tells us.

This soft version is not a Jesus to get excited or passionate about or offer our young people. This soft Jesus is not the awesome one of the gospels. He is not the one who came to bring a sword, not peace. He is not the one who shouted at us to tear out our eye if it was accessing porn on the internet. He is not the one who told us to shun revenge and violence so prevalent in TV, movies, and video games. He is not the one to told us to turn our one cheek when the other is slapped, and to offer no resistance. He is not the one to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, visit the imprisoned and forgive from the bottom of our hearts. This awesome Jesus said all this. It's right in the gospels.
