Dear Parishioners:

This Sunday is the last day of our Liturgical year. The church reminds us that whatever happened in the past year, Jesus is the King. Hence the celebration of the FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING!

Pilate asked Jesus: "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus didn't answer, at least not directly. But Jesus didn't claim the title. Much to Pilate's confusion, Jesus admitted to being king, but not in a realm that Pilate could comprehend. Jesus had no need to cling to status. He knew why he was born and sent into the world. He claims that his only purpose in life was to testify to the truth.

If being a king means that nothing and no one can constrain you, then Jesus is the King of Kings because he knows what he is about and no one can take that away. He is not just king over other lesser kings and presidents; He is above the most powerful leader of this world: He is king of the universe. He controls the world. He is more than and above the pandemic that we experience today.

Ultimately, that is the point of this feast. Those who choose Christ as their king, buy into his preaching about the reign of God. As king, Jesus defined his realm as one in which the greatest is the one who serves the most.

Today' gospel proclaims: Jesus loves us. Jesus freed us. Jesus made us to be a kingdom. Will we participate? Will we do our part to be part of the Kingdom?
