Dear Parishioners:

Today we celebrate the *Baptism of the Lord*. This feast brings an end to the Christmas season. Monday brings us back to Ordinary Time.

After John the Baptist immersed Jesus in the waters of the Jordan River, the Son of God rose up, water trickling down his face, standing anointed as he lifted his eyes to the skies. A heavenly confirmation came when the voice of God came from the heavens: *"You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."* The word beloved has some very enchanting synonyms - precious, cherished, treasured, prized, admired, valued. Do we really know our value as beloved by God?

What can we take away from today's celebration of the Baptism of the Lord? First, we can celebrate the reality that our baptism links us to Christ and to all who have gone before us in faith. Our baptismal certificate stands as our identity card. It tells us to whom we belong and to what we are called. Jesus' response to his baptism reminds us that the ceremony is but one tiny moment, the meaning of which is determined by how we live it out. Baptism gives us a mission. To discern that mission, we too must pray and listen to the Scriptures. The practical way to do this is to regularly celebrate the Eucharist with the rest of the baptized members of our faith community.

Baptism is a commitment to a mission. At our own baptism, God says the same to us: "We are anointed with holy oils; we are garbed in white; we are given a candle to keep the flame of faith burning brightly in our hearts." Today is a good day to check our candles and make sure they are still burning. Amid the pandemic, by virtue of baptism, we are bearers of light - shedding hope and strength to people who are losing faith in God.


