

THE RULES FOR FASTING & ABSTINENCE

We are obliged to observe *Fasting and Abstinence*. According to the teaching of the Catholic Church: ▶ The law of Abstinence

forbids the use of meat and prohibits the eating of meat on Fridays throughout the year. ▶ The law of Fasting allows only one full meal a day but does not prohibit taking some food in the morning and evening. ▶ Abstinence and Fasting are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and on the Friday of the Passion and Death of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Who are obliged to observe these precepts?

▶ Anyone aged 14 and above are bound by the law of *Abstinence*. ▶ Anyone aged between 18 and 59 are obliged to *Fast and Abstain*. ▶ Nevertheless, Pastors and parents are to see to it that minors who are not bound by the laws of *Fasting and Abstinence* are educated in an authentic sense of penance.

All Fridays within the Season of Lent, there will be NO Morning Mass. In the evening at 7 pm there will be the WAY OF THE CROSS followed by Mass.

WORDS FROM CARDINAL COLLINS: The Eucharist Archdiocese remains the source and summit of our of Toronto life in Christ. For Christians, participation in the Sunday Eucharist is the central experience of the week, and

in the Sunday Eucharist is the central experience of the week, and that is the foundation for the obligation of every Catholic to be personally present at Mass every Sunday. Of course, if there is a legitimate reason (such as being sick) this obligation does not apply. But as the restrictions are lifted, now is the time to encourage Catholics to return to physical presence at Sunday Mass, if not impeded for a legitimate reason, in keeping with our basic Sunday obligation as Catholics.

WorshipSafe Protocols effective March 1, 2022

These new Archdiocese protocols have been edited by the pastor.

①All capacity limits, including physical distancing requirements, are removed from churches and parish halls. Parishes may wish to continue with distancing at the discretion of the pastor. ②Indoor mask use is still required for those over the age of two. (Limited medical exemptions apply). ③The kiss of peace is still discouraged at this time. A bow or wave should continue to be used as an alternative. ④Holy water fonts can be refilled. Prayer books, hymnals, magazines, bulletins - can return to the church. ⑤Altar servers and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion can return to pre-pandemic duties. ⑥Choirs and cantors still must be masked or three metres from anyone else. ⑦Proof of vaccination is not a requirement to enter Archdiocese of Toronto churches.

Baptism can return to pre-pandemic practices.
Confessionals and confession rooms can reopen, provided that both parties are masked.
The use of hand sanitizer upon entry to the church and before the distribution of Holy Communion remains a best practice and is encouraged.
Meetings in parish halls may resume for those who may wish to do so. Mask use is required.

Contact tracing and online Mass registration systems are no longer required. Reporting all Covid cases is not longer required.

Dear Parishioners:

We enter the season of Lent - the *First Sunday of Lent*. Luke tells us a story in which the challenge of tempting Jesus makes the devil so desperate that he actually imitates Jesus and quotes Scripture to induce him to betray his identity and vocation.

God allowed his Son to be tempted as a human being. We too are certainly tempted, as a Church, as community, as families, as marriage partners, as parents, as children, as individuals. Tempted by so many things that seem so good. Tempted by so many opportunities that seem to promise to increase our wealth, our comfort, our social acceptability, our power. All seemingly so easy to do...and all so faithless. All so foreign to what we are called to be.

In the desert Jesus did not debate with Satan. He didn't try to match wits with him. He simply said NO. Faithfulness. Fidelity to what he knew was God's design. My strength is founded in my relationship with God; it is founded in prayer. And how blessed I am - how blessed we are - that when facing any temptation to be less than who we are called to be as Christians, we might call out in prayer with the beautiful psalm response: "Be with me, Lord, when I am in trouble."

The church suggests that if we want to stay strong before temptation, let's engage the practices of prayer, almsgiving and fasting.

We have many individuals in our churches who are living on their own in very fragile health and NEED OUR HELP. My vocational call as a Parish Nurse, since 2003, has been to try to assist these individuals and their families to obtain the Circle of Support they need.

I urgently need the assistance of two personal attendants to assist an 86-year-old female with her *Activities of Daily Living* for 3-5 hours per day. These individuals must have current CPR and First Aid and at least one must have a current or pending healthcare registration. Salary is to be negotiated.
