




Ushers needed at all masses. Please contact the office if you can help and for which mass you are available. Teenagers can usher to earn volunteer hours.

PARISH LENTEN CELEBRATION OF CONFESSION

Canon #1457: According to the Church's command, "after having attained the age of discretion each of the faithful is found by an obligation faithfully to confess serious sins at least once a year. Anyone who is aware of having committed a mortal sin must not receive Holy Communion without having first received sacramental absolution. Children must go to the sacrament of Confession before receiving Holy Communion for the first time."

To comply with this sacred obligation, the parish has designated *Thursday, April* 7th as our Day of Confession.

Dear Parishioners:

This Sunday is the 5th Sunday of Lent, a week before the Holy Week. The Gospel tells the story of the woman accused of adultery. The woman was dragged into the middle of a circle and Jesus was called upon to act as a judge. The woman was exposed in public, accused by the requisite number of witnesses and the crowd had already reached their verdict. The crowd was waiting for Jesus to make his own judgement.

Instead of condemnation, Jesus invited the morally perfect to cast the first stone. Jesus aimed at getting the crowd to come to their senses. Realizing their own imperfection, no one threw a rock. Instead, they all walked away. St Augustine commented that at the end of this story, only two were left: misery and mercy. All Jesus needed to offer her was mercy: "Neither do I condemn you. Go your way, and from now on do not sin again."

There is truth to this statement: The name of Jesus is *mercy*. As we approach the end of Lent, we are given an encouraging note for all of us who still fear repentance. No matter how many times or how hard we fall, Jesus says to us the words that close today's Gospel reading:

"NEITHER DO I CONDEMN YOU."
