The countdown to Christmas is moving on. Today is the SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT. The time is drawing short. Unfortunately, the reminder is too often put in terms of how many shopping days are left until Christmas.

CONFIRMATION UPDATES for Grade 7 students who wish to celebrate Confirmation with St John Fisher Church. Families of the candidates must attend Sunday Eucharist

regularly. Parents should be registered members of St John Fisher Parish. If you live within the boundaries of the parish and are not registered, please do so by completing the yellow Registration forms are in the wall pocket at the back of the church. Those students who go to another church must celebrate their Confirmation at their own parish church.

Important events:

• December 10th/11th: Registration Forms will be available at the back of the church. Take one home, fill out the required information and attach a copy of your Baptismal Certificate.

• December 17th/18th: Return completed registration form and present it to our catechists at the back of the church. • January 14th/15th: Enrolment Ceremony. The family attends their usual mass and will receive the copy of the rite at the entrance. The Confirmation candidate will prepare a hand-written (or typed) letter on a proper piece of paper, addressed to the Pastor, indicating why they want to be Confirmed. During Mass, the priest will call on the candidates to present their letter to him and receive the Blessed Wooden Cross to wear every day. • Tues Jan 24th at 7 pm: Mandatory meeting for Parents and Teens in the parish hall.
