

To My Beloved Parishioners:

The birth of Jesus created shock waves throughout creation. The angels were the first to feel it. They were God's highest, noblest creatures. They shouted "Alleluia!"

Secondly, the shepherds were the first visitors to the manger. They were simple, hardy, outdoor, rough-cut men in tune with the climate and cycles of creation. All they saw was this little baby. There was no divinity apparent in Jesus, all babies look pretty much the same. Yet they simply believed what the angel told them and immediately adored the baby as somebody greater than themselves. They represent the simple and humble people of the world.

Thirdly, the wise men (Magi) who came from far away arrived on the scene. They represent the whole world. This is the *Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord*. Epiphany means *manifestation*. Christ is revealed as Lord and Saviour of the whole world. The first reading speaks of kings, camels and dromedaries as well as gold and frankincense.

The magi represent all the nations (you and I, all the races and all colors and beliefs). All were present when Christ was born. We might think, "Surely tyrants and dictators are excluded" or "Surely there's no place for atheists or agnostics". NO! They tell us, simply and profoundly, that no one is excluded from the love of God. "All the nations on earth will adore you Lord..." Gay or straight, addicted or free, male or female, faithful or faithless, saint or sinners, we are all welcomed to the grace and love found in Jesus Christ.

Finally, there is Herod the Great. He reminds believers of the hostility of Herod and his successors shown to Jesus both at his birth and his death. Along with him, the inhabitants of Jerusalem are also against Jesus. It warns us also that the secular society will not be friendly with those who follow Jesus. Christians are persecuted in many parts of the world.

In the midst of all this global darkness, we are the sign of God in this world.
