FROM THE

Beloved Parishioners:

Today is the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. The colour of the vestment in Ordinary Time is green. After the celebration of festivities are done with, we are back into ordinary way of life.

John's entire vocation was to point people to Jesus, the one who was to come after him. In the Gospel, John directs his disciples to Jesus: "Behold the Lamb of God." He speaks of the one to come after him whose sandal he was not worthy to untie.

The Gospel uses three terms to describe Jesus: Lamb of God, Rabbi and Messiah. All three titles speak somehow of Jesus' vocation. John may have used Lamb to refer to the Passover Lamb of the New Testament. Throughout the Gospel, Jesus will act as a teacher or rabbi. The concept of what it means to be the Messiah will go through a process of clarification through the entire Gospel as the disciples come to understand what the title means according to Jesus' own understanding and way of life. Together the three titles offer three different and complementary perspectives on Jesus' vocation. Let us try to learn all these as we listen attentively to the Gospel in a regular basis, i.e., every Sunday.

The coming week brings the start of the annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity - January 18-25. This universal week of prayer encourages Christians of all denominations to meet, to participate in various liturgical and other community activities, and to pray together that all may be one, as Christ desires.

All members of the parish should seek to have a deeper understanding of ecumenism. I encourage you to google ecumenism to learn more.
