

Dear Parishioners:

As we enter into the *Third Sunday of Lent*, today's readings focus on water. We have the story in the Gospel in which Jesus first approaches a woman on the level of human need. He asks her for water.

Water is life. We have to have water to live. A person can live up to three weeks without food but only three days without water. A woman encounters Jesus at Jacob's well while drawing water for her household. Their thirst brings them together. They both need water. Jesus' thirst is physical. The woman, too, thirsts. She longs to have the burdensome work of hauling water completed for another day.

During the time of Jesus, women and men that were not related did not talk or have any association with one another in public. Add to this that Jews and Samaritans had been the bitter enemies for centuries.

And yet, the two sit, talk and listen to one another. Through their mutual acceptance of the other, the walls, boundaries, hostilities and hatreds which had long separated Samaritans and Jews, melt away and disappear.

We say that water is very necessary to live, just as communication is vital for good relationships. Prayer, almsgiving and abstinence can help us improve our relationship with God, our neighbour and ourselves - in that order. The key to the effectiveness of these is an openness of heart to listen with love, understanding and forgiveness.

Canon #1457: According to the Church's command, "after having attained the age of discretion each of the faithful is found by an obligation faithfully to confess serious sins at least once a year. Anyone who is aware of having committed a mortal sin must not receive Holy Communion without having first received sacramental absolution. Children must go to the sacrament of Confession before receiving Holy Communion for the first time."

To comply with this sacred obligation, our Parish Day of Confession is: *Thursday, March 30th* from 6:30 - 8 pm. Please arrive at the beginning of the celebration.
