Dear Parishioners

Today is the *Fifth Sunday of Easter*. Jesus said in the Gospel: "*Whoever has seen me has seen the Father*." It is a belief in the Old Testament that to look at God is to invite death. The vision of God was granted only to very few individuals like Moses and the great prophets, but then only in some symbolic form. Moses saw God in the image of burning bush.

Here, when Philip asks Jesus to show them the Father, he probably means he wants to experience the great theophany (appearance) of God at Sinai. But Jesus tells him that theophanies and visions are no longer necessary now that the Word of God, who is God, has become flesh and can be touched and seen. In seeing Jesus, one sees God. Jesus is one with the Father in his mission. "When you see me, you have seen the Father." Jesus has been with the Father from the beginning of time. And Jesus will be with the Father for all eternity.

Now that Jesus has returned to the Father, to see Jesus is to see him in the least of his brothers and sisters. "Whatever you do to these little ones you do it to me," says Jesus. We, Christians, are the icon of God in the world.



The custom of dedicating the **MONTH OF MAY TO MARY** started at the end of the 13th century. It became especially popular among Jesuit students that it spread to the whole church by 1700.

MARY IS A MODEL FOR THE CHURCH:

- ▶ The Second Vatican Council describes Mary and her role from the scriptures and Catholic tradition. Mary is a model for the Church and for individual Christians. What God has done in Mary he also does in us.
- ▶ Chosen by God. The Father chose Mary to be the mother of his Son. He chooses each of us to carry out a unique vocation on earth, within his beloved Church.
- ▶ Gifted with faith. The Father endowed Mary with special gifts of grace from the moment of her conception. He gives each of us grace and faith at the time of our baptism, and continues to give us gifts to work for building up his Church.
- ▶ Called to obedience. Mary was invited to obey God's will for her in her daily life. Jesus Christ also came to do the Father's will. We too, as Church and as individuals, are called to obey the will of the Father each day.
- ▶ Rewarded in heaven. At the end of her life on earth, Mary was raised, body and soul, to share in the eternal life of her Son. At the end of time, with the resurrection of the faithful, the entire Church in heaven will be together with Christ and Mary, singing the unending praises of the Father.
