**Beloved Parishioners:** 

As Lent progresses, we come closer to the heart and meaning of the Gospel. The story in the Gospel starts with some Greeks who approached Philip and said: "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. What a strange answer they received from Jesus:

"Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit."

What is the connection between seeing or knowing Jesus with the mention of his death? If we want to know Jesus, we have to accept the meaning of his suffering and death. Only by going through his death, Jesus demonstrates the purpose of his life and glory.

Now and again, we all need to confront the fact that we will die; knowing that leads us to evaluate our purpose and worth of each day. After all our dreams (careers, goals in life) eventually disappear, what matters most as a Christian, is to respond to what Jesus has done for us.
