

As you have no doubt been hearing, this year is a Jubilee Year. What does this mean? Below is an explanation from our Archdiocesan website:

JUBILEE YEAR 2025 - PILGRIMS OF HOPE

The Catholic Church worldwide will be celebrating a special Jubilee Year in 2025. This has been a tradition dating back to the year 1300 when Pope Boniface VIII announced the first Jubilee, which is also referred to as a *"Holy Year"*. The frequency has changed over time, with a Jubilee year originally celebrated every 100 years, later every 50 years and, more recently, every 25 years or at the request of the Holy Father.

The Jubilee Year includes many celebrations within the city of Rome, and local initiatives in dioceses around the world. The theme of the 2025 Jubilee will be "*Pilgrims of Hope*". In the words of Pope Francis: "*We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us, and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision.*"

As we enter this sacred time of Jubilee, I encourage all parishioners to grow in your love of the Lord so that at the end of this Jubilee Year 2025 you will be true Pilgrims of Hope for the world.

THEME OF THE MESSAGE FOR WORLD PEACE DAY 2025



"Forgive us our trespasses: grant us your peace" "rogive us our trespasses: grant us your peace" is the theme chosen by the Holy Father for the World Day of Peace 2025.

This Message corresponds to the biblical and ecclesial understanding of the Jubilee Year. It is inspired in particular by the Encyclical Letters Laudato si' and Fratelli Tutti, and above all by the concepts of Hope and Forgiveness, which are at the heart of the Jubilee, a time for conversion that calls us not to condemn, but instead to bring about reconciliation & peace.

When considering the reality of conflicts and social sins afflicting humanity today in light of the hope inherent in the Jubilee tradition of the forgiveness of sins and the cancellation of debts, together with the reflections of the Fathers of the Church in this regard, concrete principles emerge that can lead to a much needed spiritual, social, economic, ecological and cultural change.

Only from a genuine conversion on all levels – personal, local and international – will true peace be able to flourish, not only in the cessation of conflicts but also in a new reality in which wounds are healed and each person's dignity is recognized.

FINDING HOPE THROUGH HOPELINE: For many people, an end-of-life diagnosis can seem completely overwhelming. It's often described as time stopping, but for those who work in hospice and palliative care, the diagnosis is just the beginning. The HopeLine was created to help newly diagnosed patients, caregivers and family members identify resources that can support them on their end-of-life journey. It's easy to access (just call 416-619-5700) and takes a customized approach with one of our compassionate team members working directly with callers to help pinpoint resources with hospice palliative care options within their home community. The HopeLine is open to any individual residing within the Archdiocese of Toronto who requires end-of-life support services and holistic care for patients, caregivers and extended family and friend networks.

The Archdiocese offers the Horizons of Hope program designed to empower and educate parishioners by addressing questions surrounding palliative care, dying, death, suffering, accompaniment and bereavement in a holistic fashion. All are encouraged to access these resources, start important conversations with loved ones, and of course, to call the HopeLine when they need extra support.
