



 Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, At the end of this week, we will see children Pas ors' excited to participate in the joys of Halloween. **CORNER** Last year, around this time, I wrote my

pastor's corner about the same topic and I feel that I would like to share what I wrote with you again, because some of you might not have read it. Here it is:

Children and candy seem to go together, don't they?

I know that there are those who believe Halloween is something we should shun as followers of Christ. And yes, sometimes children dress up in inappropriate costumes – but this is not their fault, but rather their parents who should know better. But overall, I prefer to see this societal celebration as a time for children to learn and enjoy the spirit of "gift giving" - even if that simply means treats of various kinds. So, for those who are not in favour of Halloween, then for your sake, maybe skip over my Pastor's corner for this weekend and just get yourself a candy to enjoy.

I remember as a young immigrant from Azores, first hearing about Halloween, and thinking what joy this would bring us – that my siblings and I would be able to go door to door and people would gladly give us sweet treats of various kinds. For us this was like heaven. All we needed to do to get these treats was dress up and say the magic words "Trick or Treat" and out would come treats for a tummy's delight. Like many immigrant families we did not have much spare money to be used on treats. So, this was an opportunity for my siblings and I to stock up for the winter months to come. We would be trick or treating for as long as we possibly could - it was a mission for us. We would return at the end of the evening and place our goodies on our kitchen table. At that moment my mother would take over. She would give us our few treats for that evening (just enough not to have our tummies hurting during the night) and would pack up the rest for the days to come. I don't know how my mom did it, but we seemed to have treats for many weeks to follow.

What a joy it was to see people open their doors and have smiles on their faces as they placed treats in our pillowcases. We would make sure that my younger sister would be the first to be seen – she was young and with her beautiful smile and innocence, we would hope for an extra treat from the homeowners. This technique came in handy when my older sister and I started to get over the age one would expect children to still go out for Halloween. I stopped going out when I was 26 years old - do you think that was too old to still go out? Don't send nasty emails to me, because I am just joking – I stopped when I was 24 years old. HA!

It's not just children who enjoy Halloween now-a-days - older people also enjoy the celebration. In my drives and walks around the neighbourhood I see the time and effort people put into decorating their homes for Halloween. All of this just adds to the joy and celebration of the night.

I wish all our children a joyful Halloween and will be saying a prayer that the weather

will be clear and warm so that our little ones can enjoy displaying their costumes and experience the smiles and kindness of people who will be giving out treats.

Oh, and by the way, if you see an "older child" that looks a lot like your pastor, then be kind to him and give him an extra treat in his pillowcase. ©
