Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

God planned that we should rest one day per ors' week. Rest is very important for the human Soul, Mind and Body. It is so important that

God made it a Commandment. With this one day of Rest, we are also able to thank the Lord "who is the Creator of all that Is and who will call us back to Him".

Sadly, we live in a world that for a number of us, we do not have the opportunity to Rest from our Labours. Some people can't even find time to worship Him as Catholics are obligated to do because companies force employees to work more and more. The cost of living makes it harder to get by and forces more and more people to work all day and then to to work at a second job. This is not right and it is causing many difficulties in families and in the psyche of the human person. People are drowned with work and they are not given the ability to follow the Creator's plan for Rest. For these individuals who are not able to take a day of rest per week, we need to pray for them and pray for our society to change its direction so that human beings are not seen as mere commodities, but for the dignity and worth they truly are as created beings of the God whom we Catholics follow.

We priests do not consider priesthood a "job". It is a Vocation just like Marriage is and yet, we are strongly encouraged by our bishop and our training, to take one day off per week. Each priest tries to find a day that works the best for his parish ministry. My day off is Mondays, but to be honest I have not been following my boss' direction (i.e. the Archbishop of Toronto). I even advise my younger brother priests to take a day off and I have not been kind to myself regarding Rest. On Mondays I can often be see in the parish office for at least half the day instead of leaving the office work behind. I am sure many of you can relate to this – we might have jobs that we cannot separate ourselves from for even a day. We might respond to emails or requests from bosses or those beneath us at work. However, this should not stop us from trying to do our very best to take a full day off.


As priests we have annual spiritual retreats and seminars that are mandatory and help us to keep our faith alive and strong, as well as keeping us updated to the needs of the changing times in the parishes. Apart from these mandatory events during the year, we priests are also entitled to one month's holiday per year. In recent years, I have not had the opportunity to take my full month off and this year is no different.

Starting this Monday, I will be away for about 2 1/2 weeks for rest and relaxation. So the next two weekends, Msgr Alfred Grima will be celebrating our Masses while I am way. He was your pastor for over 25 years and has been retired for over 8 years.

I consider myself blessed to take some time off and I am fully aware that many of you do not have the opportunity to get any holidays. In recognizing this sensitive reality, I will not be sharing where I will be going. I will share that I will be away from my siblings and will try to stay disconnected from the parish during this time. But knowing me and how I function, I will probably reach out to the parish and read my emails once a day to deal with any emergencies that might come up. I will do my best to keep to the "once a day" rule so that I can smell the roses and get some sun.

I hope to see you all after November 20th and pray that none of you will get sick or die while I am away. So, while I am away no emergencies please! ©
