



Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ, This weekend we begin a new Pastors' Liturgical Calendar with the beginning of the Season of Advent. The Church has a

three-year cycle (A, B and C) – In Year A the focus is on the Gospel of Mark, in Year B the focus is on the Gospel of Matthew and in Year C the focus is on the Gospel of Luke. We have just completed Year C and we now move to Year A.

The Church has 5 Seasons throughout the Liturgical Year.

- **1** Advent is the first Season and begins our Liturgical Year. The priest wears purple vestments and it is four weeks long. The fourth week of Advent is often not a full seven days long because Christmas day rarely lands on a Sunday.
- **2** Following the season of Advent, we have the Season of *Christmas* and the priest wears white vestments. The length of the Christmas season varies from two to three weeks and ends with the feast of the Baptism of the Lord.
- **3** The third Season is *Lent* and the priest wears purple vestments. It begins with Ash Wednesday and lasts for is 40 days; remember that Sundays are not considered Lenten days.
- **4** Following Lent we have the Season of *Easter*. The priest wears white vestments, and it lasts about 50 days.
- **5** The final Season is called *Ordinary Time* and it is the longest season. The priest wears green vestments. It first appears following the Christmas season for a number of weeks; it pauses for the Seasons of Lent and Easter and then continues again until the end of the Liturgical Year which concludes with the Feast of Christ the King.

As we begin this season of Advent, let us prepare ourselves for the season of Christmas – but let's not move into the joy and celebration of Christmas right away. Instead, let us use this Advent time to prepare our hearts for the Coming of the Lord.

WHAT IS ADVENT?

&A season of hope, preparation, expectations and celebration. The advent wreath is a popular symbol used as the focus of prayer throughout the season. &Advent means a coming or arrival.

The four candles mark the steps in our Advent journey and symbolize hope, peace, joy, and love, each representing a vital aspect of our spiritual preparation for Christ's coming. **Hope:** calls us to trust in God's promises and anticipate His arrival with faith, reminding us of the prophetic hope expressed by Isaiah. \(\delta \mathbb{Peace} : \text{emphasizes reconciliation and the peace that} \) Christ brings to our hearts and the world, echoing the angel's message of peace at His birth. \(\delta Jov:\) celebrates the joyful anticipation of Christ's coming, often highlighted by the lighting of the pink or rose candle, symbolizing the joy of the Gospel and the approach of Christmas. & Love: underscores God's infinite love manifested in the Incarnation, urging us to emulate Christ's love through our actions & preparations. &As we prepare for Christ's birth, we also remember the events that surrounded the Lord's coming long ago; celebrate his coming
