The very first statue of Carlo Acutis was made in the Philippines by Felman Limlengco Bagalso of Paete Laguna in October 16, 2020.

**Other Facts:** Carlo Acutis was an English-born Italian Catholic youth and amateur computer programmer, who is best known for documenting Eucharistic miracles around the world and cataloguing them all onto a website that he created before his death from leukemia. Carlo Acutis has Catholic parents that don't go to church but Carlo goes to church everyday. Carlo Acutis as a child stood out for his joy, generosity and great love for God. He said the Eucharist was his highway to heaven and prayed the Rosary everyday. He participated in volunteer work and his friends loved him very much. He was very talented with computers and programming, and used this gift to evangelize on the early Internet. He offered his illness and his pains for the Pope and the Church. The Church recognized a miracle attributed to his intercession, the healing of a Brazilian child who suffered from a rare pancreatic disease in 2013. Carlo is also a gamer and a scientist who loved not only the Eucharist but also soccer.
